Mr. Cadle had a very distinguished career in the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. He was initiated in the lodge at Princeton, Mo., April 25, 1873, when 21 years of age, receiving five degrees and also the degree of Rebekah on that occasion. During the succeeding 12 years he passed through the various offices of his lodge and of the Grand Lodge of Missouri, and served as Representative of the Grand Lodge to the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

Mr. Cadle was of a most kind and liberal nature. His charities were numerous and constant. He was, besides, a most entertaining companion. Having a keen sense of humor, he was a story-teller of marked originality, to which were added rare powers of mimicry. Yet there was never anything of malice in this—only a genial and kindly humor.
