Hour, Date, Place	Summary of Events and Information	Remarks and references to Appendices
September, 1st.	The Battalion moved from RIBEMONT, moving first along the ALBERT-AMIENS Road, then, branching off, moved along a second class road through several small villages. Dinners were issued at a half after half-way. The destination was PIERREGOT, a small place about 14 km. North-East of AMIENS.	
September, 2nd.	The Battalion moved off at 8.30 a.m. The route was through TALMAS on the AMIENS-DOULLENS Road. A halt was again made after half-way and dinner taken. The route in the afternoon was through CANDAS - Army Headquarters of R.P.C. - then through FIENVILLERS to AUTHEUX, where the Battalion billeted.	
September, 3rd.	The Battalion rested in billets.	
September, 4th.	The Battalion moved through LE MEILLARD, FROHEN-LE-PETIT, and FROHEN-LE-GRAND to BONNIERES. This was a rather better village than those we had been accustomed to of late. As well as the 5th. Scottish Rifles, the 2nd. Royal Welsh Fusiliers and 20th. Royal Fusiliers were in the same village.	
September, 5th.	The Brigade moved ^{through} VACQUERIE, MONCHEL, BLANGERMONT, and the Battalion billeted in LINZEUX.	
September, 6th.	There was a short move to HERICOURT, a small place about 9 km. South-West of ST POL.	
September, 7th.	The Brigade did not move.	
September, 8th.	The Battalion moved by HAUTE-COTE, NUNCO, and billeted in HOUVIN-HOUVIGNEUL. This village was considerably cleaner and better than most, and there was plenty of accommodation.	
September, 9th.	This day's move was by REBREUVIETTE to IVERGNY, a small place
